Grade 5

GOAL #1:

Demonstrate knowledge of WV music history and cultural heritage

LEARNER OUTCOMES:

The student will:

- 1.1 Understand relationships between music, the other arts and disciplines outside the arts by:
 - a. Interpreting events in West Virginia history through the singing of, listening to and writing about WV music produced by WV musicians or songwriters.
 - b. Comparing similarities and differences in the meanings of common terms used in the visual arts, music, dance and theatre to terms used in other disciplines.
- 1.2 Understand music in relation to history and culture by:
 - a. Recognizing examples of folk, classical, jazz and popular music produced by WV musicians and songwriters.
 - b. Comparing the lives and music of WV composers from different musical periods.
 - c. Describing how the elements of music (pitch, rhythm, harmony, form and tone color) are used in musical examples of American Culture.
- 1.3 Use a variety of technology by:
 - a. Experiencing WV historical repertoire through electronic media.
 - b. Using the Internet as a research tool.
 - c. Using graphic organizers, such as charts/graphs, to gather and present research.

The student will:

- 2.1 Utilize classroom experiences when attending West Virginia cultural programs both inside and outside their school community by:
- a. Synthesizing classroom instruction regarding West Virginia musicians and songwriters through a variety of performances.
- b. Using appropriate music vocabulary when discussing types of musical performance and performing groups
- c. Demonstrating audience behavior appropriate for the content and style of music performed.
- d. Experiencing music performed and composed by West Virginians either by live or recorded performance.

Grade 4

- Identifying by genre or style examples of music from various WV historical periods
- Experiencing songs composed or sung by WV songwriters or musicians
- Use of a variety of technology by:
- Experiencing WV historical repertoire through electronic media.
- Using the Internet as a research tool.
- Using graphic organizers, such as charts/graphs, to gather and present research.

GOAL #2:

Participate in the cultural/musical life of the WV community through local and regional music opportunities.

LEARNER OUTCOMES:

The student will:

- 2.1 Utilize classroom experiences when attending WV cultural programs both inside and outside their school community by:
- a. Synthesizing classroom instruction regarding West Virginia musicians and songwriters through a variety of performances.
 - b. Using appropriate music vocabulary when discussing types of musical performance and performing groups.
- Demonstrating audience behavior appropriate for the context and style of music performed.

STANDARDS

Grade 3

GOAL #1

- Understand relationships between music, the other arts and disciplines outside the arts by creating a personal response, alone or through collaboration.
- 1.2 Understand music in relation to West Virginia history and culture by:
 - Locating the geographical regions of the state and the West Virginia artists that live(d) there.
 - Performing songs written by West Virginia composers.
 - Listening to and discussing style differences in music of various WV musicians and periods in West Virginia history.

- 1.3 Use of a variety of technology by:
 - Experiencing WV historical repertoire through electronic media
 - Using the Internet as a research tool.
 - Using graphic organizers, such as charts/graphs, to gather and present research.

Grade 2

- Listening to and discussing the work of various West Virginia songwriters and musicians and their stylistic differences throughout the state's history.
- Use a variety of technological tools to:
- experience repertoire through electronic or digital media.
 - b. use the Internet as a research tool.
 - c. prepare graphic organizers, such as charts/graphs; gather and present research.

GOAL#2:

Participate in the cultural/musical life of the West Virginia community through involvement in local and regional music/arts opportunities.

LEARNER OUTCOMES

The student will:

- 2.1 Utilize classroom experiences when attending cultural programs by:
- a. Synthesizing classroom instruction regarding West Virginia musicians and songwriters through a variety of performances.
 - b. Using appropriate vocabulary.

- 2.1 Utilize classroom experiences when attending cultural programs both inside and outside the school community by:
- a. Transferring West Virginia musical knowledge to an understanding of a variety of performances both inside and outside the school community.
 - b. Using appropriate music vocabulary when discussing types of musical performance and performing groups.
